

CITY OF CROWLEY
REGULAR MEETING
NOVEMBER 9, 2010

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Crowley, Louisiana, the governing authority of the City of Crowley, met in a regular session at 6:00 p.m. Tuesday the 9th day of November, 2010 at the regular meeting place of said Mayor and Board of Aldermen, the Council Chambers, 426 North Avenue F, Crowley, Louisiana.

Mayor Greg A. Jones presided with the following Aldermen present: J. Elliot Doré, Jeff Doré, Lyle Fogleman Jr., Vernon Martin, Mary Melancon, Laurita Pete, Steven Premeaux, Kitty Valdetero and Todd Whiting.

Alderman Steven Premeaux led the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag and Alderman Vernon Martin gave the invocation.

BE IT KNOWN AND REMEMBERED, that on this the 9th day of November, 2010, at 6:00 p.m., in accordance with a resolution of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Crowley, Louisiana, adopted on the 8th day of June, 2010, and recorded in the records of the Board of Aldermen of the City of Crowley in the Minute Book, notice of which regular meeting was issued and published according to law, the undersigned members of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Crowley, Louisiana, being a quorum thereof, met in the chambers of the Board of Aldermen of the City of Crowley, City Hall, Crowley, Louisiana, and, according to law, publicly examined and canvassed the returns of said election, as shown by the official tabulation sheets compiled by the Clerk of Court of the Parish of Acadia, according to law, which returns were received by the Clerk of Court from the Commissioners-In-Charge of said election held on the 2nd day of November, 2010, in accordance with said resolution, to determine the following propositions, to-wit:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

RENEWAL OF FIVE (5) MILL STREET MAINTENANCE TAX

SUMMARY: To authorize the City of Crowley to levy and collect a Five (5) Mill Tax (“Renewal”) annually for a period of ten (10) years for the purpose of Street Maintenance.

1. Shall the City of Crowley, State of Louisiana, (the "City") under the provisions of Article VI, Section 22, Section 27(B), Section 30(A) of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, continue to levy and collect a Five (5) Mill Tax on all property subject to taxation situated within said City (current estimated annual amount of \$332,123.48), annually for a period of ten (10) years, commencing with the year 2011 and ending in the year 2020, for the purpose of constructing and maintaining streets, roads, highways and avenues in the said City?

PROPOSITION NO. 2

**RENEWAL OF FIVE (5) MILL PUBLIC BUILDING & DRAINAGE
MAINTENANCE TAX**

SUMMARY: To authorize the City of Crowley to levy and collect a Five (5) Mill Tax (“Renewal”) annually for a period of ten (10) years for the purpose of Public Building and Drainage Maintenance.

1. Shall the City of Crowley, State of Louisiana, (the "City") under the provisions of Article VI, Section 22, Section 27(B), Section 30(A) of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, continue to levy and collect a Five (5) Mill Tax on all property subject to taxation situated within said City (current estimated annual amount of \$332,123.48), annually for a period of ten (10) years, commencing with the year 2011 and ending in the year 2020, for the purpose of maintaining public buildings, constructing and maintaining bridges and maintaining public grounds, public parks and the drainage system of the said City?

PROPOSITION NO. 3

**RENEWAL OF THREE-FOURTHS (3/4) MILL CEMETERY
MAINTENANCE TAX**

SUMMARY: To authorize the City of Crowley to levy and collect a Three-Fourths (3/4) Mill Tax (“Renewal”) annually for a period of ten (10) years for the purpose of Maintaining Cemeteries.

1. Shall the City of Crowley, State of Louisiana, (the "City") under the provisions of Article VI, Section 22, Section 27(B), Section 30(A) of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, continue to levy and collect a Three-Fourths (3/4) Mill Tax on all property subject to taxation situated within said City (current estimated annual amount of \$49,835.55), annually for a period of ten (10) years, commencing with the year 2011 and ending in the year 2020, for the purpose of maintaining cemeteries, title of which is in the name of said City?

WHEREAS: The Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality has directed the City of Crowley, Louisiana to perform a Municipal Water Pollution Prevention (MWPP) audit on its Wastewater Treatment Facility located on Conrad Road and;

WHEREAS: The City of Crowley, Louisiana has prepared and reviewed the attached MWPP audit and;

WHEREAS: The MWPP audit has noted a potential problem with a significant increase in average and maximum flows being reported at the treatment facility and in the collection system and;

WHEREAS: The City's partial rehabilitation of the rock filter did assist in ultimately lowering pollutants being discharged to the receiving stream and;

WHEREAS: The City of Crowley, Louisiana wishes to guard the public health and assure discharge compliance;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT the City of Crowley, Louisiana hereby informs the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality (LDEQ) that it has set forth through the Mayor and Board of Aldermen the following actions necessary to attain and maintain permit discharge compliance contained in LPDES Permit Number 0041254:

- 1) The City of Crowley expects to continue the rehabilitation of public leaks through an ongoing smoke testing/repair maintenance crew.
- 2) The City has a notification program for private leaks. Private individuals are notified of defects on their property and the repairs are monitored and cataloged.
- 3) The post-rehabilitation flow monitoring results have been and will be used to design and construct pump station upgrades, detention facilities, interceptors, and/or relief lines, etc. to reduce bypasses in the collection system.
- 4) With the increase of flows being experienced at the treatment facility, the City will increase its efforts toward combating I/I.
- 5) The City has received grant funding under the LCDBG FY 2010-11 Program for I/I repairs in areas of northeast and southeast Crowley where defects are known to be present. The City expects to take bids on this work in the first quarter of 2011 and complete this project within the next reporting period.

ORDINANCE NO. 1413

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, CORRECT AND RE-ENACT ORDINANCE NO. 1412 OF THE CITY OF CROWLEY TO INCLUDE THE CORRECT TITLE OF THE FLOOD INSURANCE STUDY (FIS) IN SECTION 5-116; TO INCLUDE SUBSECTIONS WHICH WERE INADVERTENTLY OMITTED FROM ORDINANCE NO. 1412 UNDER SECTION 5-126 IN THE AMENDMENT AND REENACTMENT OF ARTICLE V OF CHAPTER 5 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CROWLEY RELATIVE TO FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION,

TO PROMOTE PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY, TO REDUCE OR MINIMIZE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE DAMAGES AND LOSSES CAUSED BY FLOODS AND TO PROVIDE DEFINITIONS OF WORDS AND PHRASES USED IN THE ORDINANCE, TO PROVIDE FOR THE LANDS TO WHICH IT APPLIES, TO PROVIDE FOR THE BASIS OF SPECIAL FLOOD HAZARD AREAS, TO PROVIDE FOR ADMINISTRATION THEREO; TO PROVIDE FOR THE PROVISIONS HEREOF TO BE SEVERABLE; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT THERETO OR IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; AND TO PROVIDE FOR ALL OTHER MATTERS RELATIVE OR PERTAINING THERETO.

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 1412 was duly introduced and notice of the Ordinance and notice of public hearing was published; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held in accordance with law on the 12th day of October, 2010, at 6:00 o'clock p.m. at City Hall, Crowley, Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, after the said public hearing, Ordinance No. 1412 was duly adopted during the regular meeting of the Board of Aldermen; and

WHEREAS, certain clerical and computer errors were discovered in Ordinance No. 1412, including an error in the title of the Flood Insurance Study (FIS) and subsections (5), (6) and (7) of Section 5-126 were inadvertently omitted from the final document which was incorporated into the minutes of the said public hearing;

NOW THEREFOR BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF CROWLEY, PARISH OF ACADIA, STATE OF LOUISIANA, IN REGULAR SESSION DULY CONVENED, THAT:

SECTION 1: Section 5-116 of Ordinance No. 1412 of the City of Crowley be and the same is hereby amended to correct the errors aforesaid and is hereby re-enacted to read as follows, to-wit:

Sec. 5-116. Basis for establishing the areas of special flood hazard.

The areas of special flood hazard identified by the Federal Emergency Management Agency in the current scientific and engineering report entitled, "The Flood Insurance Study for Acadia Parish, Louisiana and Incorporated Area" dated November 26, 2010, with accompanying Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) dated November 26, 2010, and any revisions thereto are hereby adopted by reference and declared to be a part of this ordinance.

SECTION 2: Section 5-126 of Ordinance No. 1412 of the City of Crowley be and the same is hereby amended to include the subsections inadvertently omitted as aforesaid and is hereby re-enacted to read as follows, to-wit:

Sec. 5-126. General standards for flood hazard reduction.

In all areas of special flood hazards the following provisions are required for all new construction and substantial improvements:

(1) All new construction or substantial improvements shall be designed (or modified) and adequately anchored to prevent flotation, collapse or lateral movement of the structure resulting from hydrodynamic and hydrostatic loads, including the effects of buoyancy;

(2) All new construction or substantial improvements shall be constructed by methods and practices that minimize flood damage;

(3) All new construction or substantial improvements shall be constructed with materials resistant to flood damage;

(4) All new construction or substantial improvements shall be constructed with electrical, heating, ventilation, plumbing, and air conditioning equipment and other service facilities that are designed and/or located so as to prevent water from entering or accumulating within the components during conditions of flooding;

(5) All new and replacement water supply systems shall be designated to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the system;

(6) New and replacement sanitary sewage systems shall be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the system and discharge from the systems into flood waters; and

(7) On-site waste disposal systems shall be located to avoid impairment to them or contamination from them during flooding.

SECTION 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
